TEAM SHEET ERROR REPORTS

2017 saw \$125 in Team Sheet Error Report fines which is a decrease on 2016. Only 1 team without TSE fines - U12/2s this number has decreased from 2016 where there were 6 teams without fines.

ONLINE REGISTRATIONS

As usual online registrations pose a stressful time until all teams are full and bulk registration is complete. Administration handles all of this, with committee members lending a hand on face to face registration dates. Online payments proved once again to be very popular and direct debits were excellent. We had our usual 3 Face to Face registrations, one at the Richmond Golf Club to favour sponsorship, and 2 at Icelly Park Canteen. We feel face to face registrations dates are pertinent and in keeping with the Richmond ideal of effective communication between committee and members, adding personal contact which can get lost with online registrations only.

We had 1 player deregistration this year. 2017 saw FNSW revert back to not refunding money once a player has taken the park. 1x O35 was deregistered as he was injured and didn't take the park therefore being entitle to a refund less NFA Admin charge. We had 3 manager de-registered who were care takers until we found permanent managers, we also had one coach move to the managers role after finding a new coach for the position.

COACH DEVELOPMENT

Grassroots coaching course was held once again at Inalls lane which our new U6s coach Andrew Kinnell attended, and Rohan Grace attending another course held on another date. This gave us once again 100% qualified coaches in the U6-U9 age groups for the second year in a row. This will also be a requirement in 2018. Steve Meredith, Ben Gabriel and Paul Boyd all acquired their 13-17's Game Training coaching qualifications in February and Paul Sweeney attended the senior coaching course. P. Kennedy also completing his 9-13s coach course and going onto coach at Icelly park 's hosting the NDFP as Jayne Pembroke did last year. The club covered the cost of most of these courses, and we have 7 more coaches with a range of coaching qualification. Therefore, as promised all NFA coaching requirements were met once again in 2017. We will continue to meet our requirements in 2018.

Team Summation.

Mini Roos: We had 12 teams this year who played a home and away basis. A decrease of 3 teams 2016.

Junior competition Teams: 8 teams, a decrease of 1 team from 2016

Senior competition Teams: 4 teams, decrease of 1 from 2016

All Age Men: Made up of returning AA13s and new players.

All age Ladies: Made up from several existing players and a few returning from other clubs etc. some 10-year players.

O35 Men: Made up of returns and new players, nearly didn't get started.

Female Teams: Down by 2 from 2016 however we still fielded 1x10G, 1x12G, 1x14G, 1x16G, 1x 1W, 1xAAW1

U12G1 being very successful, comp winners, Champion of champion representatives, and CST Finalists.



EQUIPMENT

Game balls were topped up once again to existing numbers. We didn't need to apply to Aldi mini roos this year for starter packs as Nepean were able to do this for all clubs, which took away delivery costs for all. We were entitled to 12 packs. They contained size 3&4 balls, ball bags, cones and mini bibs. Goal Keeper gloves were also purchased. Our new style of shorts was purchased in 2016 were actually made obsolete, therefore we were unable to order further stock to top up our existing numbers. We were forced to change the style for the second time in 2 years, as we were unable to match the new style ordered. This became an enormous fiasco for our poor new equipment officer Sonia who did a sterling job under the circumstances which also happened to drag out for quite a few months. Goal Keeper gloves and shin pads were purchased to bump up stocks. Our newer style socks were purchased and were dearer but quite popular. Coach and Managers shirts were purchased this year without the words "coach or manager" on them, to make it more flexible when they have a change of role.

FACILITY EQUIPMENT - no big purchases were made during this financial year. We have a grant currently being scrutinized for a grandstand and 2 dugouts.

PARK MAINTAINENCE AND IMPROVEMENTS

Weed spraying took place at the appropriate times, as did aerating. Summer comp goal posts were once again installed so Summer comp could be run.

Icely park was closed for one weekend during the season again due to wet weather. Pre-season was a nightmare with only one pre-season weekend being available due to bad weather. All goal mouths have been re-turfed in October, all have died, and we are waiting to see if the regrowth has taken.

Policies - 2016 saw the continuation of our committee member and family discount policy, this was to provide more of an incentive to help on the committee, and to try and keep playing soccer at Richmond more viable for families. Our planned hardship policy was partially drafted however no further work was completed for it to be implemented as yet. Our constitution is still a "work in progress" and we have sought the assistance of knowledgeable NFA board D.Skuthorpe to assist us to get it updated and in line with the governing bodies requirements, as too will other policies that need to be implemented and documented. Our stance on WWCC "no exemption" has also continued, for all coach, managers & committee, with a 98% compliance rate.

INJURIES- serious injuries were on the decrease in 2017, with only 1 insurance claim submitted, which was from Summer Soccer 2016.

CLUB MEMBER INVOLVEMENT - Club member involvement is always encouraged. We are always looking to recruit members to help on the committee and are happy with any amount of help offered no matter how big or small. Once again Margaret Ireland, who has a daughter serving on the committee and 2 grandchildren playing at Richmond, was happy to volunteer at our Pink Day, & we were happy to have her assistance on the lolly/cake bar on this very big day. A shout out also to Lyndsay Meredith, Steve's dad, who has also been around to assist on our big day BBQ's, including pink and junior presentations, and does an excellent job cooking those snags to perfections. Ami Wood needs a mention, she is always on hand to pick up a job also on these busy occasions - except fairy floss twirling, this year went to Morgan Darling, who followed in Ami's footsteps distributing fairy floss to our most appreciative juniors. Unfortunately, we have said goodbye to Ethel Sherratt, who was also volunteering extra time to the club with various jobs. Needing to pursue her own business needs, we do thank her for her years of service which has mounted up over the years.

Our Face Book page has continued to be a great tool for quick distribution of important information to our members. Our Website has been revamped now and our website editor does a great job of adding and deleting all necessary info needed. Sadly, we have needed to block 2 people from the use of our Face book, they were from a neighbouring club which is even more alarming.

CLUB PHOTOS: This year, Kerri Darling graciously has picked up the baton left by Ethel and organised our Club Photos, what a mammoth task! Kerri did an excellent job with our autumn themed 50th year team photos, looking fantastic.

YEAR BOOK: Runs hand in hand with our photos, our 50th Anniversary Year Book job was also created by Kerri Darling, and as with the Club photos she has produced a wonderful publication.

SOCIAL EVENTS: Our 50th Blue and Gold Ball kind of took over any other intentions of further social events, see report later on this.

PRESENTATIONS - SUB-JUNIOR includes U6/7/8 teams. We seem to have found success with this format of holding the sub- junior presentation separately from the Junior. Our younger players find it very hard to sit still for any length of time. The main aim is relativity, on their last playing day, they receive their trophy, a slushy, sausage sizzle, get their face painted and have a jump on the jumping castle. We also managed to gather enough items to give each player a goody bag, which was successful last year. This took place on Saturday 19/8. A slight problem with the trophy centres staying on, an emergency super glue situation, however still a lot of problems with the centres sticking properly!



JUNIOR- Held Sat 9th September at Icely Park. This year hosted 14 teams, from U9's to U16Girls. All teams had great patronage. Again, a problem with trophies, a weakness in the trophy saw at least half a dozen or more breaking on the day, needing to be fixed. The kids had a slingshot, a gladiator, and a jumping castle for the younger ones, fairy floss, sausage sizzle and face painting. Young and old enjoying all this entertainment. Thanks to all helpers esp committee. SENIOR: Once again the Clarendon hotel for our very casual senior presentation. Finger food, cob dips, mini desserts for \$10 entry fee. This year we tried something a little different with a bush band and a 50th anniversary mug instead of trophies. Some negative feedback, interesting what people think they are entitled to for participation, and how far \$10 stretches, however some are never happy no matter what we do.

CANTEEN REPORT - In 2017 we employed 3 girls to do various days in the canteen and 1 boy for Sundays. Darci, Aimmee, Del and Ethan were fabulou all year, we thank them. We feel that the enforcement of committee or members to man the Canteen and BBQ takes away from maximising their soccer experience. We find its always the same parents volunteering constantly, therefore paying the canteen workers benefits all members greatly, whilst creating employment for either members or the wider community, these workers also learn employment skills. Their wages are drawn from Games Fees. The player-of -the-match slushy program for juniors we implemented 3 years ago continues to prove very popular, and now with the new 3-barrel slushy machine it's much more productive! 2017saw the continuation of the Saturday bbq, thanks largely to Steve Meredith who has agreed to not only do the weekly purchasing but man the bbq as well. A big commitment and a load off the rest of the committee. Customers were able to obtain bacon/egg/sausage sandwiches from the first games to nearly the last. Thanks to Steve's dad Lyndsay as well for lending a hand when needed, we are very grateful. The bbq was quite popular. We continued with our healthy choice of fruit, and our home-made goodies - caramel slice/cookies/cupcakes & banana bread. Home Made pies also continued, purchased fresh from Pies On the Run at Clarendon. Pepper Steak and bacon & cheese pies always popular.

FINANCIAL REPORT - looks grim at first sight and is still being processed due to a glitch with the MYOB program at this stage. Taking into account the fact the Richmond Club has not paid our Clubgrants grant in this financial year (2 lots were paid in the previous), 2 lots of trophy invoices were paid in this financial year amounting to over \$9000. We outlaid over \$4000 for our Blue and Gold 50th Anniversary ball - a one of occasion. Less teams transfers to less regos and less income. So still looking quite good, please see separate financial report.



PINK SOCK DAY 2017 - This year we asked ALL 24 teams to jump on board. We managed to get all of the teams on board - some kicking & screaming! to wear pink socks to raise money for the McGrath foundation, and have Pink day in the aim of raising not only funds for them but also the Cancer council whilst raising breast cancer awareness. Just would like to mention IT'S NOT ABOUT THE SOCKS!!!! The socks are a by-product of what we are aiming for. Yes, we all have a few pairs of pink socks, high quality I may add and great for training. This year posed to be quite tricky, as with a smaller number of teams, no weekend was actually "big" so we set about sending e-mails asking for a couple of games to be reversed, and asking if a couple of games could be moved to assist fundraising. We had some great responses, we also extended the purchase of pink socks to opposition teams as well. Lowlands U7, Blaxland 12/3s, Glenmore Pk U10G1 & Colo ladies all took us up on the offer, a fantastic gesture, & once again NRG this year purchasing socks. Donators came from everywhere, Pies On The Run, Slush and Stuff, Fun Active Entertainment, Loads Of Fun, Violet the facepainting clown, cakes, deploy - soccer balls. We had quite a few stalls, Jamberry, Amandas Place, Jason's Tupperware, The Embroidery Lady, Serenity Clothing, Kriswin Designs, Calx Candles and a toy stall. Even ex-socceroo Archie Thompson signed a ball for our raffle! Our expectations were exceeded when with less teams we were able to donate \$850 to each charity, and the purchase of 347 pairs of pink socks, outstanding effort from all! OTHER INITIATIVES: once again Richmond ExSSC encouraged more of our teenage players to become game leaders for the U6 and 7's, mainly to relieve some pressure from the coaches who were generally doing that as well as trying to coach and also sometimes manage. This worked really well. This year it was Claire

Grime, Aimmee Dibley, Chloe Arundale, and some younger players Cambell Boyd, Ethan Wallace & Riley Cotter. Isaac McElhinney ran our U8/9's and U10/11's when needed, Chloe also helping with U8/9s.

ANZAC 100 YEARS celebration continues and once again, Jayne Pembroke and Tracey Boyd laid a wreath on behalf of Richmond ExSSC

GIRLS SKILLS CLINIC: once again we were able to host a girl's skills clinic run by James from NFA, those girls who attended enjoyed themselves immensely. HOSTING NPD's IcellyPark was the venue for another NDP program this year. We hosted some Holiday clinics in April and earlier in the year. We also played host to a Monday night 10-week course from May to August, which was headed up by one of our own coaches Peter Kennedy. We were happy to help out where we could with hosting.

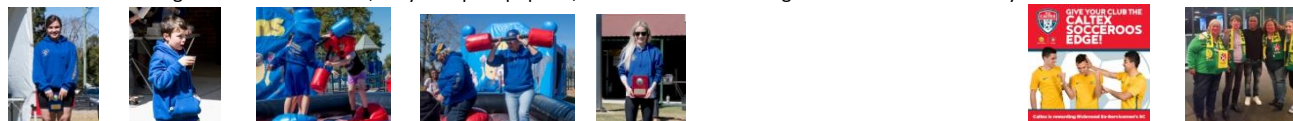
