ONLINE REGISTRATIONS

As usual online registrations pose a stressful time until all teams are full and bulk registration is complete. Administration handles all of this, with committee members lending a hand on face to face registration dates. Online payments proved once again to be very popular and direct debits were helpful. The introduction of an eftpos machine was extremely advantageous. Once again we held 3 face to face registrations, one at the Richmond Golf Club and one evening and one Saturday at Icely Park canteen. We introduced a registration and photo consent form for all registrations, which was met with a little resistance as members thought all they should do is the online part. It was tricky chasing up missing paperwork. We feel face to face registrations dates are pertinent and in keeping with the Richmond ideal of effective communication between committee and members, adding personal contact which can get lost with online registrations only.

We had 14 (1 manager and 13 players) deregistrations in 2016, they were for varying reasons, 4 from injury other various mostly from the senior age groups.

COACH DEVELOPMENT

This year Colo hosted a Grassroots coaching course at Inalls Lane 16/3. 7 of our mini roos coaches attended, S.Smith, J.Pembroke, P.Nassar, T.Krawzcyk, R.Wilson, T.Boyd and J.Coupe, (R.Wallace attended at another date). This gave Richmond ExSSC 100% compliance in U6-U9 coaching requirements; the other mini roos coaches have current qualifications. Icely Park played host to a Skills Training Certificate Coaching Course for 9-13 age group over 3 nights 1/4/8th April. 30 coaches attended, of which 10 were from Richmond ExSSC – S.Smith, J.Pembroke, J.Coupe, R.Wallace, P.Luthy, T.Boyd, P.Boyd, D,Gambrill, S.Killeen and S.Walters. Giving us a total of 13 newly accredited coaches for the club. An outstanding effort to all those attendees. Hopefully we will be able to keep this



standard going in 2017, when all division 1 teams will require a qualified coach. Richmond ExSSC will continue to encourage as many coaches to be accredited as possible.

Team summation

Mini Roos: We had 15 teams this year who played a home and away basis. A decrease of 3 teams on 2015

Junior Competition Teams: 9 teams in this category, an increase of 2 from 2015

Senior Competition Teams: 5 in all, decreasing by 1 on last year.

All Age men: 1 team, the same as last year. This was made up of returning AA from last year and an U21 team that didn't have enough players.

All Age Ladies: 2 teams decreased by one on last year.

O35 Men – 1 team, going up a division, excellent results in running 3rd in the league and making an appearance in the CST finals.

Female Teams: we have maintained our female player numbers. In 2016 we fielded U10, U12, U13(14G3), U14, U16, U17 and 2x AAW teams.

One team AAW1 reaching the CST final and winning it.

EQUIPMENT

Playing and training balls were topped up once again to existing numbers. We applied once again to AIA Vitality Mini Roos for their mini roos club co-ordinator packs available for delivery fees only to all Mini Roos teams U6 - U11. We ordered 18 packs. This year the packs contained size 3 and 4 balls and ball bags. We kept these and were able to distribute them to the U6-U8 players at their presentation. Goal Keeper gloves were also purchased. A new style of shorts were purchased as well, a fraction dearer \$5, however seemed to be popular. We will be looking at new style of socks for purchase for 2017 season. Also a little dearer but better quality. We continued with the Coach and managers shirts for 2016 and should be able to continue this into the future.

FACILITY EQUIPMENT

Another 3 barrel second hand slushy machine was purchased for the canteen. We didn't purchase a coffee machine as yet, it is still in the works. A new 5 burner bbg was purchased. This increased the revenue for the canteen as it was utilised for the return of the Saturday morn bacon eggs and sausage sizzle, thanks to S.Meredith who manned it nearly every weekend, also to Bligh Pk Butchery for their delicious meat.



PARK MAINTAINENCE AND IMPROVEMENTS

Weed spraying took place at the appropriate times, as did aerating. Summer comp goal posts were once again installed so Summer comp could be run.

Icely park was closed for one weekend again due to wet weather, a very unusual occurrence, but the photos show the story.

Policies - 2016 saw the continuation of our committee member and family discount policy, this was to

provide more of an incentive to help on the committee, and to try and keep playing soccer at Richmond more viable for families. In 2017 we will be looking to implement a hardship policy, with very strict guidelines. Our constitution is still a "work in progress" and we will sought the assistance of knowledgeable NFA board members to assist us to get it updated and in line with the governing bodies requirements, as too will other policies that need to be implemented and documented. Our stance on WWCC "no exemption" has also continued, for all coach, managers & committee, with a 98% compliance rate. INJURIES- serious injuries were on the decrease in 2016, with only 1 insurance claim submitted.

CLUB MEMBER INVOLVEMENT - Club member involvement is always encouraged. We are always looking to recruit members to help on the committee, and are happy with any amount of help offered no matter how big or small. We have 3outstanding volunteer contributions that help us out in various ways, as they did in 2015. Once again Margaret and Gerald Ireland, who have a daughter serving on the committee and 2 grandchildren playing at Richmond. They are generally free to lend a hand at our big events such as sub-junior and junior presentations and also our pink fundraiser day, although Margaret was not available on all of those dates this year (as she was meeting other volunteer commitments), Gerald still came to assist. I reiterate last year's sentiments - they are priceless in their efforts and their energy knows no bounds and we are the lucky recipients of their valuable time. Richmond ExSSC are grateful to have their assistance. The other is Ethel Sherratt, who has previously served on our committee and as a team manager when her younger son was playing. Ethel's oldest son Dean, is playing for the AA13 this year. Ethel is our year book editor (If you have seen our year book publications, you will know what an excellent job she does!) and our Photo Day organiser, seriously we would not know where to start without her endless willingness to help out with these enormous tasks. Any job Ethel takes on, is always completed thoroughly. Ethel also helps with a few smaller jobs as well such as , helping tweak Summer Comp team sheets and field configurations, she has also undertaken the scanning of some of our rare year books, so they can be preserved which is a huge job. All this whilst starting a family business and moving house. Another person, where thank you is just not enough. A mention needs to go to Ben Johns, who often gave a hand at the bbq, as well as Jeff Coupe and Sonia Moss who also just dug in at various times when we were under the pump. Ami Wood and Lauren Kwast always on hand, esp. on pink Day to perform a number of tasks.

Our Face Book page has continued to be a great tool for quick distribution of important information to our members. Our Website has been revamped now and our website editor does a great job of adding and deleting all necessary info needed. We also changed our website host this year, again thanks to Cyril who organises all website issues. A big thank you to Kerrie Darling who has been on hand at all our club events to take photos.

CLUB PHOTOS - as mentioned before Ethel Sherratt took on the responsibility of this mammoth task. A lot of work put into the photos, keeping them at affordable for all families.

YEAR BOOKS - Ethel also organised and edited the year books which have become a popular keepsake for all. Once again thanks to the coach/managers who finally all managed to add their team spiels, they came out brilliantly. Another great job completed

SOCIAL EVENTS - sadly we had none organised this year, we were looking at having a club night at the Richmond Greyhound track, however this was put on hold due to the uncertainty of Greyhound racing at the time. Hopefully this event will go ahead this year in some form.

PRESENTATIONS - SUB-JUNIOR includes U6/7/8 teams. We seem to have found success with this format of holding the sub- junior presentation separately from the Junior. Little people find it very hard to sit still for any length of time. The main aim is relativity, on their last playing day, they receive their trophy, a slurpie, sausage sizzle, get their face painted and have a jump on the jumping castle. We also managed to gather enough items to give each player a goody bag, something we have aimed for, for a few years but were unable to achieve. CANTEEN REPORT: In 2016, we employed 3 girls to work, all (when we had a big day) on Saturday and one on Sunday. We feel that the enforcement of committee or members to man the Canteen and BBQ takes away from maximising their soccer experience. We find its always the same parents volunteering constantly, therefore paying the canteen workers benefits all members greatly, whilst creating employment for either members or the wider community, these workers also learn employment skills. Their wages are drawn from Games Fees. The player-of -the-match slushie program for juniors we implemented 2 years ago continues to prove very popular, and it's helpful when the slushie machine was fully functional! 2016 saw the return of the Saturday bbq, thanks largely to Steve Meredith who agreed to not only do the weekly purchasing but man the bbq as well. A big commitment and a load off the rest of the committee. This explains the rise in canteen income. Customers were able to obtain bacon/egg/sausage sandwiches from the first games to nearly the last. Thanks to Steve's dad Lyndsay as well for lending a hand when needed, we are very grateful. The bbq was quite popular. We continued with our healthy choice of fruit, and our home made goodies - caramel slice/cookies/cupcakes & banana bread. Home Made pies also made their return purchased fresh from Pies On the Run at Clarendon.

FINANCIAL REPORT - 2016 saw us back into the black, an increase from 2015's loss. This can be attributed to a number of things. The Richmond Club paid their Club Grants for 2015 and 2016 in the same financial year. Summer comp for 2015 was a huge success, making a very tidy profit. Saturday BBQ increased canteen takings, fundraising was up over \$1000 from 2015. Richmond ExSSC find ourselves in what we feel is a very strong financial position heading into our 50th year, and have the hardworking committee to thank for getting us back on track. Not forgetting, we managed to build our canteen awning also in 2015. Please see separate financial report for further details.

<u>COMMUNITY SUPPORT</u> - This year saw us continue our business board, which is nearly full. We encourage our members to put up their business cards to help support their business and help those in need of that trade or service. We also donated \$200 to the Paralympics soccer team to assist them in their efforts to get to Rio.

PINK SOCK DAY 2016 - After the success of Pink Ladies Day in 2015 we decided to aim higher. This year we asked ALL 29 teams to jump on board.

We managed to get 27 of our 29 teams! to wear pink socks to raise money for the McGrath foundation, and have Pink day in the aim of raising not only funds for them but also the Cancer council whilst raising breast cancer awareness. We tripled sock sales to over 320 pairs. We picked our biggest game day we had for the season, which included 16 games, plus 2 more that were bought back to Icely park, after opposition clubs kindly agreed. NRG even came on board, we provided pink socks to the refs for the day and they wore pink caps. We provided a jumping castle, face painting(time was donated), a lolly and high tea bar, with some mangers kindly donating cakes. We had 5 stallholders this year, and Fran Refalo, president of NFA came to lend a helping hand. We had a 100 club with a pink soccer ball and other prizes, raffles and jellybean guessing. Everybody working very hard for the cause. We notified opposition clubs of what was happening, and some of them jumped on board as well.
