**NB 2021 the Admin position was continued throughout.

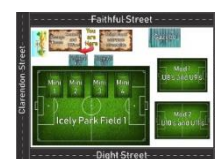
Club Ideals 2021

ONLINE REGISTRATIONS

The Playfootball system still has glitches, the worst allowing people to have 2 FFA numbers which is still an ongoing issue! Active Kids Vouchers were available again this year, making a greater difference especially to deposits collected. 2021 saw a continuation of our packaged rego and game fee products once again being very successful and we will continue to provide this for the future. Administration handles all of this, with committee members lending a hand on face-to-face registration dates. Online payments proved once again to be very popular as was eftpos. We had our usual 3 Face to Face registrations, 28/1, 3/2, 6/2 one at the Richmond Club to favour sponsorship, and 2 at Icely Park Canteen. We feel face to face registrations dates are pertinent and in keeping with the Richmond ideal of effective communication between committee and members, adding personal contact which can get lost with online registrations only. Muster week was 9/2 to 12/2. We had 13 player deregistration's 2021

At the date of shut down we were chasing 39 fully or partial outstanding rego/game fees, to date 11 have paid at least registration portion.

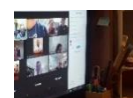

Policies – 2021 saw the continuation of our committee member and family discount policy, this was to provide more of an incentive to help on the committee, and to try and keep playing soccer at Richmond more viable for families. We formulated the basis for a Life membership nomination policy and grading policy discussed by the committee. Our planned hardship policy has not proceeded any further as yet. Our constitution is still a "work in progress" and we have sought the assistance of knowledgeable NFA board D.Skuthorpe to assist and she has sent us a copy with suggested updates and improvements etc, now to get onto reading and updating our constitution, on which progress has been made. WWCC "no exemption" is now a minimum requirement, for all coach, managers & committee. Covid plans and guidelines needed to be updated by the Admin, as were training schedules which were covid safe. Attendance forms were pre-filled and available for all teams if required. The icompman app had a training attendance aspect which helped managers greatly.

Their wages are drawn from Games Fees.

The player-of -the-match slushy program for juniors we implemented 8 years ago continues to prove extremely popular,2021 saw the continuation of the Saturday bbq, (which was also covid upgraded with a Perspex guard), thanks largely to Steve Meredith who has agreed to do the weekly purchasing and mostly man the bbq, Denise Sondermeyer, Rod Wallace & Ben Gabriel jumping in when Steve was unavailable.
