TEAM SHEET ERROR REPORTS

2019 saw \$125 in Team Sheet Error Report fines which is an increase of \$70 from 2018. 3 teams without TSE fines - this number has decreased from 2018 where there were 6 teams without TS fines. \$300 worth of forfeit fines.

ONLINE REGISTRATIONS

The introduction and absolute rush through of playfootball, the new registration system from FFA was a complete disaster from the beginning and still ongoing issues occurring now! Active Kids Vouchers were a little easier this year with them being available from the 1st January, making a greater difference. 2019 saw a continuation of our packaged rego and game fee products once again being very successful and we will continue to provide this for the future. Administration handles all of this, with committee members lending a hand on face to face registration dates. Online payments proved once again to be very popular and direct debits were excellent. We had our usual 3 Face to Face registrations, 31/1, 6/2, 9/2 one at the Richmond Golf Club to favour sponsorship, and 2 at Icely Park Canteen. We feel face to face registrations dates are pertinent and in keeping with the Richmond ideal of effective communication between committee and members, adding personal contact which can get lost with online registrations only. Muster week started as traditionally scheduled 12th February We had 4 player deregistration's 2019.

COACH DEVELOPMENT

A.Gibbs, our new U6 coach attended the grassroots course, giving us once again 100% qualified coaches in the U6-U9 age groups for the fourth year in a row. S Klippert (13-17s), D.Gambrill and G Kilby both acquired their (9-13's)Game Training coaching qualifications in March. The club covered the cost of these courses. Therefore, as promised all NFA coaching requirements were met once again in 2019. We will continue to meet our requirements in 2020.

Team Summation.

Mini Roos: We had 11 teams this year who played a home and away basis. A decrease of 2 teams from 2018.

Junior competition Teams: 9 teams, a decrease of 1 from 2018

Senior competition Teams: 6 teams, an increase of 2 from 2018

All age Ladies: 2 teams with majority the same and a few new players the same from 2018.

O35 Men: Made up of returns and new players

Female Teams: A decrease of 1 from 2018 (2nd U16Girls team was absorbed into AAW4), 1x12G, 1xU14G, 1xU16G, 2xAAW

U12G1 & AAW1 being the most successful, as competition runners, CST final winners and Nepean Cup winners.

EQUIPMENT

Game balls were topped up once again to existing numbers. Once again Nepean took care of Aldi mini roos starter packs, We were entitled to 13 packs. They contained size 3&4 balls, ball bags, cones and mini bibs. Shin pads were purchased to be made available for those in need. Our newer style socks were repurchased and were quite popular. Coach and Managers shirts were purchased this year again to accommodate new additions. We purchased 100 nylon boot bags which were given to the U6/7/8's and to the U12Girls in addition to their trophies.

<u>FACILITY EQUIPMENT</u> – a laptop was purchased, previous laptop badly needing an update. Now windows 10 had upgraded which enables us to be compatible with Association etc. Updated printer purchased for the canteen. Soup pot purchased for the canteen, based on rising popularity of pumpkin soup.

PARK MAINTAINENCE AND IMPROVEMENTS

Weed spraying took place at the appropriate times, as did aerating. Our Goal mouths have been returfed and thanks to the October downfall, they took very well. GRANT (Community Building Partnership) FOR PARK IMPROVEMET, DUG OUT SHELTERS and upgraded seating. With the assistance of Hawkesbury Sports council, Richmond ExSSC successfully applied for a grant to use for the upgrading of our existing seating and the building of our dugouts/technical boxes. The grant being \$5500 and sports council adding \$6240 and Richmond ExSSC adding \$2716 plus kind. We were able to purchase sturdier and larger seating, we also self-installed all of the seating with hard work from the committee. An extremely kind donation of the concrete slabs underneath the awnings was given by an very generous parent who wishes to remain anonymous. We are very grateful for his assistance which bought us in under budget and allowed to make the slab the size which suited much better.

Policies - 2019 saw the continuation of our committee member and family discount policy, this was to provide more of an incentive to help on the committee, and to try and keep playing soccer at Richmond more viable for families. Our planned hardship policy has not proceeded any further as yet. Our constitution is still a "work in progress" and we have sought the assistance of knowledgeable NFA board D.Skuthorpe to assist and she has sent us a copy with suggested updates and improvements etc, now to get onto reading and updating our constitution. WWCC "no exemption" is now a minimum requirement, for all coach, managers & committee, with a 100% compliance rate.

INJURIES- 5 serious injury /insurance applications were on the increase of 3 in 2018.

<u>CLUB MEMBER INVOLVEMENT</u> - Club member involvement is always encouraged. We are always looking to recruit members to help on the committee and are happy with any amount of help offered no matter how big or small. This year saw Anthony McLane, Morgan Darling and Lauren Kwast step up to general committee roles, they were always available to assist when needed. Morgan and Lauren taking up the job of cleaning out the canteen and storerooms and giving our canteen interior a much needed spruce up with the blue and gold paint. Anthony, or Emu as he is much better known always on hand with some elbow grease to lend a hand with the manual tasks.



Once again Margaret Ireland, was happy to volunteer at our Pink Day, & we were happy to have her assistance on the lolly/cake bar on this very big day. A shout out also to Lyndsay Meredith, Steve's dad, who has also been around to assist on our big day BBQ's, including pink and junior presentations, and does an excellent job cooking those snags to perfection.

Our Face Book page has continued to be a great tool for quick distribution of important information to our members.

Our Website has been revamped now and is looking more modern and user friendly. Kerri has also instigated Instagram for the club which has proved extremely popular
