2020 COVID 19- This year as we well know, was like no other. Just as we had gotten over the bushfire smoke and a mini flood, along came a virus called covid-19, which shook everyone's world and bought a halt to our season. Closure came from FFA on Tuesday 13th March and was to go to 14th April, when the 14th April got closer, they extended closure to May 31st. From 25th May we were able to 'return to train only', however lots of prep was required prior to anyone actually setting foot on the park. Guidelines and a specific training scheduled had to be written & approved by NFA and Sports council. Then all guidelines needed to be put into action. Meetings (via zoom/Microsoft teams) with the association and with our own coach/managers were essential, and in the midst of this, we were told that even though all soccer activities had been suspended until 30th May, the state govt had banned outdoor

activities until the end of June. We also needed to purchase hand sanitiser, hospital grade disinfectant, gloves, extra cloth's and we managed our own branded personal sanitiser. Signage also needed to be printed and laminated. A few trips to Officeworks to sort that.

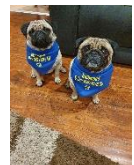

TEAM SHEET ERROR REPORTS

2020 saw \$130 in Team Sheet Error Report fines which is an increase of \$5 from 2019. 4 teams without TSE fines - this number has increased from 2019 . \$325 worth of forfeit fines. \$300 for 1 team withdrawal

ONLINE REGISTRATIONS

The Playfootball system still has glitches, the worst allowing people to have 2 FFA numbers which is continual issue! Active Kids Vouchers were available again this year, making a greater difference especially to deposits collected. 2020 saw a continuation of our packaged rego and game fee products once again being very successful and we will continue to provide this for the future. Administration handles all of this, with committee members lending a hand on face to face registration dates. Online payments proved once again to be very popular and direct debits were excellent. We had our usual 3 Face to Face registrations, 30/1, 5/2, 8/2 one at the Richmond Golf Club to favour sponsorship, and 2 at Icely Park Canteen. We feel face to face registrations dates are pertinent and in keeping with the Richmond ideal of effective communication between committee and members, adding personal contact which can get lost with online registrations only. Muster week was delayed a week due to minor flooding on 8/9th Feb in the area & was rescheduled week of 12th February. We had 24 player deregistration's 2020,



mostly due to covid, where there was a period allowed without penalty and some after the date, which unfortunately made it unable for us to make a refund, however some of these players did not advise us at all of them not playing.

COACH DEVELOPMENT

We will continue to meet our requirements in 2021. Coach courses were put on hold for quite a while due to covid.

EQUIPMENT

Game balls were topped up once again to existing numbers. Shin pads were purchased to be made available for those in need. Our newer style socks were repurchased and were quite popular. Coach and Managers shirts were purchased this year again to accommodate new additions. Goal Keeper gloves were a must due to non-sharing guidelines of covid, as were the need to top up goalkeeper jerseys in the smaller sizes of 80,85 &90. A new battery was ordered for the defib, at no cost as we are part of a program.

FACILITY EQUIPMENT – Committee reinstalled all of our old seating (benches) in various spots around the park. These had been removed whilst our home and away team dugouts were being installed. 3 sets of Bazooka (badly needed) pug goals were retrieved through our Football nsw/summer comp program and our powerade purchase points.

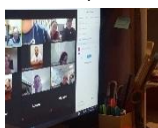
PARK MAINTAINANCE AND IMPROVEMENTS

Policies – 2020 saw the continuation of our committee member and family discount policy, this was to provide more of an incentive to help on the committee, and to try and keep playing soccer at Richmond more viable for families. Our planned hardship policy has not proceeded any further as yet. Our constitution is still a "work in progress" and we have sought the assistance of knowledgeable NFA board D.Skuthorpe to assist and she has sent us a copy with suggested updates and improvements etc, now to get onto reading and updating our constitution. WWCC "no exemption" is now a minimum requirement, for all coach, managers & committee. Covid plans and guidelines needed to be written by the Admin, as were training schedules which were covid safe. Attendance forms were pre-filled for all teams for an easy transition, an arduous task.

INJURIES- 8 serious injuries occurred however not all applied for insurance /insurance.

CLUB MEMBER INVOLVEMENT - Club member involvement is always encouraged. We are always looking to recruit members to help on the committee and are happy with any amount of help offered no matter how big or small. Deanne Gambrell assisting greatly with the aiding many a manager (including opposition managers) with EMS implementation, for some an IT nightmare which was quite challenging at times, and others just a breeze. Dea was also quite busy assessing many a major injury esp on a Saturday, where she was available for the majority, and every second Sunday, an unenviable job.

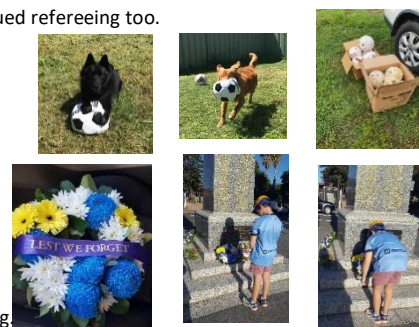
