TEAM SHEET ERROR REPORTS

2018 saw \$55 in Team Sheet Error Report fines which is a decrease from 2017. 6 teams without TSE fines - this number has increased from 2017 where there was 1 team without fines.

ONLINE REGISTRATIONS

As usual online registrations pose a stressful time until all teams are full and bulk registration is complete. Active Kids Vouchers were as good as were annoying, we endeavoured to distribute as much information as possible. 2018 we packaged our rego and game fees together which turned out to be very successful and we will continue to provide this for the future. Administration handles all of this, with committee members lending a hand on face to face registration dates. Online payments proved once again to be very popular and direct debits were excellent. We had our usual 3 Face to Face registrations, one at the Richmond Golf Club to favour sponsorship, and 2 at Icely Park Canteen. We feel face to face registrations dates are pertinent and in keeping with the Richmond ideal of effective communication between committee and members, adding personal contact which can get lost with online registrations only.

We had 2 player and 1 manager deregistration's.

COACH DEVELOPMENT

Grassroots coaching course was held once again at Icely Pk which our new U6/7/8/9s coaches and others R Gabriel, B Gabriel, E Micallef, D Sondermeyer, D Gambrell, E Gomez, M Yuletian, M Stoten attended, and N Cox, and S Walters attending other courses held on other dates. This gave us once again 100% qualified coaches in the U6-U9 age groups for the third year in a row. S Hargraves and M Vella both acquired their 13-17's Game Training coaching qualifications in September. R Wallace, D Gambrell and T Boyd are all two thirds through their goal keeper coaching course, which will be finalised in January. The club covered the cost of most of these courses. Therefore, as promised all NFA coaching requirements were met once again in 2018. We will continue to meet our requirements in 2019.

Team Summation.

Mini Roos: We had 13 teams this year who played a home and away basis. An increase of 1 team from 2017.

Junior competition Teams: 10 teams, remaining the same as 2017

Senior competition Teams: 4 teams, remaining the same from 2017

All Age Men: Made up of returning and several new players

All age Ladies: increase of 1 more team than 2017. AAW5 made up from 2017 IM's and returning and new players

O35 Men: Made up of returns and new players

Female Teams: Remaining the same from 2017 however differing configuration, 1xU12G, 1xU14G, 2xU16G, 2xAAW U12G2 being the most successful, as competition winners.

EQUIPMENT

Game balls were topped up once again to existing numbers. We didn't need to apply to Aldi mini roos this year for starter packs as Nepean were able to do this for all clubs, which took away delivery costs for all. We were entitled to 12 packs. They contained size 3&4 balls, ball bags, cones and mini bibs. Shin pads were purchased to be made available for those in need. Our newer style socks were repurchased and were quite popular. Coach and Managers shirts were purchased this year again to accommodate new additions. 50th Anniversary Hoodies were ordered to top up our original order and we had a great response.



FACILITY EQUIPMENT – another 3-barrel slushy machine was purchased second hand from the pie shop and our old slushy machine was refurbished and mounted on a trolley to make easy access when needed. We still have an outstanding grant for 2 dug outs and new benches along Faithful street, which will be started in November.

PARK MAINTAINENCE AND IMPROVEMENTS

Weed spraying took place at the appropriate times, as did aerating. Our Goal mouths have been returned and thanks to the October downfall, they took very well. The sprinkler system has been checked and rechecked and were found to be not working properly so some much-needed maintenance was applied. A new watering schedule was implemented in late October and will be monitored as to its efficiency. A deposit was made to Correct constructions so that they could start work on the dug-out awnings asap. Quotes have been re done so as orders for bench seats can be ordered.

Policies - 2018 saw the continuation of our committee member and family discount policy, this was to provide more of an incentive to help on the committee, and to try and keep playing soccer at Richmond more viable for families. Our planned hardship policy was partially drafted however no further work was completed for it to be implemented yet. Our constitution is still a "work in progress" and we have sought the assistance of knowledgeable NFA board D.Skuthorpe to assist us to get it updated and in line with the governing bodies requirements, hopefully we will see this soon.. We were able to implement and document a chaperone policy. WWCC "no exemption" is now a minimum requirement, for all coach, managers & committee, with a 100% compliance rate.

INJURIES- 2 serious injury /insurance applications were on the decrease in 2018.

CLUB MEMBER INVOLVEMENT - Club member involvement is always encouraged. We are always looking to recruit members to help on the committee and are happy with any amount of help offered no matter how big or small. Once again Margaret Ireland, who has a daughter serving on the committee and 2 grandchildren playing at Richmond, was happy to volunteer at our Pink Day, & we were happy to have her assistance on the lolly/cake bar on this very big day. A shout out also to Lyndsay Meredith, Steve's dad, who has also been around to assist on our big day BBQ's, including pink and junior presentations, and does an excellent job cooking those snags to perfection.

Our Face Book page has continued to be a great tool for quick distribution of important information to our members. Our Website has been revamped now and is looking more modern and user friendly. Kerri Darling has also taken over this job.

CLUB PHOTOS: Once again, Kerri Darling has organised our Club Photos, which is a mammoth task! Kerri did an excellent job with this year's team photos, looking fantastic with the new design.

YEAR BOOK: Runs hand in hand with our photos, our Year Books were also created by Kerri Darling, and as with the Club photos she has produced yet again a wonderful publication.

SOCIAL EVENTS: Greyhound Social Night, we held just for the sake of a social night out at the Greyhound Race track at Londonderry. \$10 per head which included a race book, finger food & entry. We provided lucky door prizes from sponsors, held a mini trivia and provided nibbles and desserts, we had a wonderful response and from all accounts everyone enjoyed their night in an easy-going atmosphere.

Defib training, we had a good response from mostly committee members attendance of our Defib training.

PRESENTATIONS - SUB-JUNIOR includes U6/7/8 teams. We seem to have found success with this format of holding the sub- junior presentation separately from the Junior. Our younger players find it very hard to sit still for any length of time. The main aim is relativity, on their last playing day, they receive their trophy, a slushy, sausage sizzle, get their face painted and have a jump on the jumping castle. This took place on Saturday 18/8.



JUNIOR- Held Sat 8th September at Icelly Park. This year hosted 13 teams, from U9's to U16Girls. All teams had great patronage. Their wages are drawn from Games Fees. The player-of -the-match slushy program for juniors we implemented 4 years ago continues to prove very popular, and now with the new 3-barrel slushy machine it's much more productive!



2018 saw the continuation of the Saturday bbq, thanks largely to Steve Meredith who has agreed to not only do the weekly purchasing but man the bbq as well. A big commitment and a load off the rest of the committee. Customers were able to obtain bacon/egg/sausage sandwiches from the first games to nearly the last. Thanks to Steve's dad Lyndsay as well for lending a hand when needed, we are very grateful. The bbq was quite popular. We continued with our healthy choice of fruit, and our home-made goodies - caramel slice/cookies/cupcakes & banana bread.
